The K. Phillip Roland Scholarship was established in memory of K. Phillip Roland (1943-1995), who was a graduate from Corning High School in 1962. Phil earned his pilot's license and helped his dad in his flying service, which was based in Corning. After earning a degree in electrical engineering from Colorado State University, Phil joined Northwest Airlines as a pilot. He was a "747" captain prior to his death prior to January of 1995. Just as Phil loved to fly, his family hopes that this scholarship will help others share in his love of aviation and education.

Criteria:

The following criteria must be met by the recipient:

1. Intend to complete a bachelor's degree
2. Interest in pursuing a vocation in engineering, science related or aviation related field.
3. Character
4. Citizenship

Eligibility:

Any Corning High School senior who meets the above criteria is eligible to apply for this scholarship. Application should include the reasons why he/she feels he or she should receive this award

Selection method:

The selection of the recipient will be based on the applicant who best fills the criteria. The selection will be made by a committee comprised by the High School faculty.

Amount:

The amount of this scholarship will be determined by the income generated by the interest earned in the account of the K. Phillip Roland Scholarship. This year's amount will be \$200.

Payment of the award will be made after the student completes his/her first semester and submits the grades to the counselor's office.
